Public Policy & International Affairs Summer Institute	No citizenship requirements. Check eligibility requirements for particular summer institutes. The PPIA Junior Summer Institutes are fullyfunded, rigorous academic fellowship programs that provide training and financial support for graduate school and facilitate ongoing professional development. All JSIs include curriculum on economics, statistics, domestic/international policy issues, and leadership topics. Students should apply for as many of the 5 JSI as possible.	Early November
Critical Language Scholarship Program	Open to US citizens. Summer intensive language study (typically in host country, living with a host family): Languages: Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese Punjabi, Russian, Swahili, Turkish and Urdu. Some languages require previous language study/knowledge which may be obtained by self-directed study by uptake of award.	Early-Mid November
Critical Language Scholarship SPARK Program	US citizenship required. Opportunity to study Russian, Chinese or Arabic throughout the academic year through online classes and activities. May complement language classes at Lafayette or can be studied independently of Lafayette offerings.	Mid November
Goldwater Scholarship	Eligibility: US citizens, permanent residents, and US nationals are eligible. Applicants must aspire to pursue a STEM research career in a natural science, mathematics or engineering.	*Mid December

Voyager Scholarship for public service	Open to rising juniors with a commitment to public service as well as plan to pursue a public service career upon graduation. Must be a US citizen, US Permanent resident, or DACA recipient. Scholars receive up to \$25K for their junior and senior years as well as summer stipend to pursue a summer work-travel experience between their junior and senior years. After graduation, Airbnb will provide 10 years of travel credit up to \$20K to continue their public service careers while broadening their horizons and connections.
