<a href="#">US-UK Summer Institutes</a>	US citizenship required. The Fulbright Commission offers different summer institutes for first years and sophomores to spend a couple weeks in the UK.	<b>*Campus application deadline TBD. Contact Dean Smith for updates.</b>
<a href="#">Critical Language Scholarship Program</a>	Open to US citizens. Summer intensive language study (typically in host country, living with a host family): Languages: Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese Punjabi, Russian, Swahili, Turkish and Urdu. Some languages require previous language study/knowledge which may be obtained by self-directed study by uptake of award.	Early-Mid November
<a href="#">Critical Language Scholarship SPARK Program</a>	US citizenship required. Opportunity to study Russian, Chinese or Arabic throughout the academic year through online classes and activities. May complement language classes at Lafayette or can be studied independently of Lafayette offerings.	Early-Mid November
<a href="#">Goldwater Scholarship</a>	Eligibility: US citizens, permanent residents, and US nationals are eligible. Applicants must aspire to pursue a STEM research career in a natural science, mathematics or engineering.	<b>*Mid December</b>
<a href="#">DAAD</a>	Variety of programs from 3-week summer courses to internships/research. Most are open to all citizens.	See website
<a href="#">Boren Scholarship</a>	US citizenship required. Study abroad in a non-Western country. Study abroad must include language intensive instruction. STEM students may opt to study abroad for the summer only. Otherwise, programs should be a semester or longer in duration.	<b>*Mid December</b>

Open to students in a discipline including, but not limited to: oceanic, environmental, biological, and atmospheric sciences, mathematics, engineering, remote sensing technology, computer &amp; information science, physical &amp; social sciences including geography, hydrology, geomatics, or teacher education that support NOAA's programs and mission. Scholarship includes paid summer internships at NOAA facilities across the US.</p>	<p>January</p>
<a href="#">Udall Scholarship</a>	<p>US citizens, and/or Native Americans, Alaskan Natives and First Nations of Canada students are eligible for the environmental concerns program. Native Americans, Alaskan Natives and First Nations of Canada students may apply for tribal policy or Native health care concerns programs.</p>	<p><b>*Late January</b></p>
<a href="#">Humanity in Action</a>	<p>No citizenship requirements. Fellows spend a month (June or July) in Bosnia &amp; Herzegovina, Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands, Poland or the US (Atlanta) working as a team alongside civic leaders addressing humanitarian issues relevant to a particular locale. Programs include seminars, workshops and project based work.</p>	<p>Early January</p>
<a href="#">Gilman International Scholarship</a>	<p>US citizens who are Pell Grant recipients may apply to spend a summer, interim, semester or year of at least 3 weeks duration abroad.</p>	<p><b>*Campus deadlines &amp; application instructions available through Study Abroad Office</b></p>
<a href="#">Freeman Asia Program</a>	<p>US citizens/permanent residents with financial need. Spend a summer, semester or year studying in Asia (Cambodia, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Laos, Macao, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand and/or Vietnam.</p>	<p><b>*Campus deadlines &amp; application instructions available through Study Abroad Office</b></p>
